

**BIOSECURITY IMPORT SPECIFICATION IMPORT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF PORCINE SEMEN
FROM AUSTRALIA INTO FIJI**

VETERINARY CERTIFICATION

Each pig semen consignment imported into Fiji must be accompanied by a certificate issued by the authorized registered **Veterinarian in charge of the A. I. Centre stating that:**

- (a) It has been produced to an A. I Centre licensed by the Australian Government Department of Agriculture to export such pig semen.
- (b) It has been previously imported into Australia and such importation was undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the Australia Government.
- (c) The pig semen is packed individual closed sealed in plastic straw clearly marked with the name of the donor boar and the A. I. Centre batch number and date of collection of the pig semen.
- (d) The pig semen donor has been subjected to regular treatments for Leptospirosis, Erysipelas. Antibiotics have been included in the diluents and giving the names of the Antibiotics used.
- (e) The fertility of the pig semen donor boar has been consistently within the normal range.
- (f) The donor boar is approved for widespread used in the country of origin.
- (g) The donor boar was originally from a herd free of Brucella infection.

4.1. A Certificate from a Government Veterinary Officer stating that the disease mentioned below have not occurred in Australia during the period of 12 months immediately preceding the date of shipment, must accompany the consignment.

- (a) Foot and Mouth Disease
- (b) Swine Fever
- (c) African Swine Fever
- (d) Vesicular Stomatitis
- (e) Aujesky's Disease
- (f) Vesicular Exanthema
