

RULES GOVERNING THE IMPORT OF ANIMAL PRODUCTS FROM NZ

Small Quantities of Animal Products Imported into Fiji from New Zealand

The Biosecurity Authority of Fiji (BAF) has amended its conditions for the import of small quantities of animal products from New Zealand. The revised import conditions for under 50kg of animal products is as follows:



1 Processed animal products (including pork) for non-commercial (personal) use and with quantities of less than 10kg per item:

- Receipts required
- No Import Permit required from BAF
- Product must be entirely of New Zealand origin
- Product must be intact commercial/retail packaging eligible for sale in New Zealand

2. Processed animal products (including pork) for non-commercial (personal) use and with quantities of more than 10kg per item:

- Import Permit required from BAF
- Product must be entirely of New Zealand origin
- Product must be intact commercial/retail packaging eligible for sale in New Zealand.

3. Processed animal products (including pork) for commercial use and with quantities of less than 50kg per item:

- Import permit is required from BAF
- Product must be entirely of New Zealand origin
- Product must be intact commercial/retail packaging eligible for sale in New Zealand
- Consignments must be accompanied by either a commercial statement such as a manufacturer's declaration or a New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries (NZ MPI) certificate stating that: "This product was derived from animals of New Zealand origin."

4. For processed animal products for commercial use and where quantities are more than 50kg per item:

existing rules apply, requiring an import permit and NZ MPI sanitary certificate.
