

In November this year, the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) funded the first ever Veterinary Legislation Support Programme (VLSP) Identification mission to Fiji.

During this period, two International consultants from Canada and Rome visited Fiji and successfully completed the mission on identifying the gaps in the current veterinary legislations of Fiji. The consultants also reviewed all other legislations 1. Biosecurity Promulgation 2008 directly and indirectly related to Veterinary domain.

Fiji's Veterinary Legislation dates back to 1973 and has not been reviewed for the past 43 years. With increased global trade and climate change, there is a grave need for the mordernisation of the legislations. The mordernisation of legislation is very important not only to meet with international standards and obligations as a 2. Animal Importation Act (Repealed) World Trade Organisation (WTO) member country but to also meet the requirements of the Fiji's trading partners mainly while trading animal and animal products.

Fiji became member of WTO since 14 Jan- 5. Veterinary Surgeons Act uary 1996 and member of the OIE since 18 May 2007. OIE conducted the Performance of Veterinary Services (PVS) in 2007 and 2014; however, country report was still in draft stage.

BAF has been representing Fiji in OIE since September 2015 with BAF Executive Chairman Mr Xavier Khan appointed as 7. Agricultural Marketing Authority Act Permanent Delegate for Fiji to OIE.

BAF through assistance of the Fijian Government and the OIE Permanent Delegate to Fiji secured assistance by OIE for the Veterinary Legislation Support Programme (VLSP) and Gap Mission to Fiji mainly to improve the Fijian Veterinary Services.

The OIE VLSP Team emphasized on the importance of harmonization of the 9. Banana Export and Marketing Act laws to Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Agreement, which includes aligning with OIE, International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) and Codex Alimentarius Commission (CAC) standards to strengthen and align the legislation to international standards for uniformity with the WTO member countries.

The OIE VLSP Team also stated that there has to be harmonization among related pieces of the legislation of respective Ministries in Fiji, such as Ministry of Health and Medical Services, Ministry of Agricul-

A report of the identification mission will be submitted by the OIE VLS consultants to OIE headquarters in Paris before it's disseminated to the OIE Permanent Delegate of Fiji through diplomatic channels. Fiji will sign the second phase mission agreement once OIE has endorsed the endorsed the engagement and assistance.

To provide for the establishment of Modernization of Fiji's veterinary legislations and harmonization with the international approach of Farm to Fork will not only improve the veterinary services but also improve the animal disease diagnostics; surveillance and response while also improve the animal welfare aspects. The improved veterinary services will indirectly improve human health as there will be better management of zoonotic diseases in the country and also meeting national obligations.

> Veterinary legislation provides the powers and authorities necessary for Veterinary Services to efficiently carry out their key functions including epidemio-surveillance, early detection and reporting of diseases, including zoonosis, rapid response to and prevention and control of sanitary emergencies; animal products food safety; animal welfare and the relevant certification of animals and animal products for export.



The World Animal Health Organisation (OIE) Focal Points

Due to the fact that the responsibilities of the delegates have increased, since the

76th General Session in May 2008, the World Assembly of Delegates decided that the delegates could nominate National Focal Points to assist their delegates in their work on specific topics. Thus, one of the rights and responsibilities of Delegates, is the nomination of focal points, which should be under the authority of the OIE Delegate, this means that when the different Focal Points forward information to the OIE, they do so under the authority of the OIE Delegate.

This practice applies even if the Focal Points depend on other departments or ministries that are not part of the jurisdiction of the Veterinary Authority, since the OIE considers, from a legal perspective, the official delegate of the OIE is the sole representative of country.

To date, OIE has identified 8 focal points:

Communication, Aquatic Animals, Animal Production Food Safety, Veterinary Products, Animal Welfare Wildlife, Animal Disease Notification to the OIE, Veterinary Laboratories

The specific tasks for each Focal Point are indicated in their respective terms of reference. Additionally, in order to support countries OIE conducts specific training workshops for each of these 8 tracks around every two years in the five regions of the OIE.
